




Prevent and Contain Wildfires: Shaded Fuel Breaks

Shaded Fuel Breaks Reduce:

- The number of trees (stand density)
- The height to live tree-tops (live crown)
- The number of little trees (saplings)
- The amount of brush (surface fuels)

Shaded Fuel Breaks Are Not Fire Breaks:

• They are NOT areas where all vegetation has been removed down to mineral soil



How Many Are Needed?


CAL FIRE has identified 9 priority shaded fuel break projects comprising ~9,000 acres in Western Nevada County.

In Eastern Nevada County an additional 9 projects comprising 9,000 acres have been identified by local fire experts.



Priority Shaded Fuel Breaks


- **1. South Yuba Rim:** 6,000 acre planning area, ~800-acre treatment. FEMA HMGP & SNC proposals under review.
- **2. Deer Creek:** 1,600 acres. FEMA HMGP proposal under review (Fire Safe Council of Nevada County is the applicant).
- **3. Ponderosa Phase 2:** 600 acres. FY22 Congressionally Directed Spending and County match are secured.
- **4. Ponderosa Phase 1:** 1,087 acres. CAL FIRE grant closed out March 15, 2022; FY23 Congressionally Directed Spending request for maintenance has advanced to budget.
- **5. Woodpecker Ravine:** 414 acres. CAL FIRE funding is secured. Estimated start is October 2023.
- 6. South County: 339 acres. CAL FIRE funding is secured. Estimated start is October 2022.










South Yuba Rim Shaded Fuel Break



Deer Creek Shaded Fuel Break






Ponderosa West Grass Valley Shaded Fuel Break, Phase 1 and Phase 2






Ponderosa West Grass Valley Shaded Fuel Break, Phase 1 and Phase 2






Woodpecker Ravine Shaded Fuel Break




Woodpecker Ravine Fuel Modification & Wildfire Resilience Zone - Critical Infrastructure

Maintenance Pays!

Scenario 1: Routine Maintenance

Year 1, Implementation \$4,000 per acre

Year 3, Maintenance \$1,000 per acre



Scenario 2: Periodic Re-Implementation

Year 1, Implementation \$4,000 per acre



Year 6, Implementation \$4,000 per acre



Year 11, Implementation \$4,000 per acre

Year 6, Maintenance

\$500 per acre





~\$8,000 per acre over 20 years

~\$20,000 per acre over 20 years
