SYRCL's 18th Annual

49 Crossing

Number of Volunteers Needed: 40

Directions: Take Hwy 49 from Nevada City north towards Downieville. Drive about 6 miles and park in the lot prior to the bridge crossing.

Important Site Information: One of the easiest sites to drive to and a very popular recreation area. There are numerous secluded swimming areas upstream surrounded by large granite rocks. Lots of bouldering, poison oak. <u>Click</u> for map.

Bear River 174

Number of Volunteers Needed: 15

Directions: Take Hwy 174 towards Colfax parking lot on the left (before bridge that crosses the Bear River). Click for map.

Important Site Information: Along the Bear River at HWY 174 there is a relatively easy trail for hiking, approximately two miles downstream. Several smaller trails branch off to the river for swimming, fishing, or just relaxing. Park at the bridge parking lot. This site may not be appropriate for small children.

Directions: Take Hwy 49 south to Mcknight exit. Make a left and an immediate right onto LaBarr Meadows Road. Continue south on LaBarr Meadows Road, and then take a left onto Dog Bar Road and continue on Dog Bar Road until you reach the bridge crossing over Bear River. Click for map.



Important Site Information: Limited parking along the road. This site is mostly covered by the Bear River Key Club. The Dog Bar Road Bridge spanning over the Bear River was built in 1935 and was widened in 2000. The Bear River at this junction is wide and shallow with lush vegetation lining its banks.

Englebright Lake for cleanup. Please bring your own life jackets and buckets. This lake is unique because of the boat-in nature of the campgrounds. Beachy campsites are located in the upper part of the lake. The lake shoreline is steep and rocky with a private rural feel to it, but there are sandy beaches with pines and oaks at some campgrounds
