Dear Mr. McInnis:

We write on behalf of our 4,000,000 plus members and supporters to urge the National Marine Fisheries Service, in the forthcoming Biological Opinion, to use your authority under the Endangered Species Act to require volitional passage for spring run Chinook salmon and steelhead above the Army Corp of Engineer's Daguerre Point and Englebright dams.

Central Valley spring run Chinook and steelhead are threatened with extinction. Your agency has identified the loss of historical spawning habitat, up to 80 percent or more, as a primary cause of their vulnerable condition. With more than 150 miles of historic habitat in the Yuba River watershed above Englebright Dam, your agency and others consider the Yuba among the best opportunities in all of California to contribute to the recovery of these species.

In the March 7, 2011 hearing regarding the existing Biological Opinion for the Corps' Yuba River dams, Judge Karlton admonished attorneys for the Corps and NMFS, "We know these fish are in trouble. We know the government hasn't done its duty. If they [NMFS and the Corps] want <u>not</u> to have judges breathing down their neck, it is easy. Do your duty." (Emphasis added) We respectfully agree with this view, mindful of the difficulty and cost of passage here. Many of our organizations are concurrently working with Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Yuba County Water Agency, and other dam operators in this basin to contribute to restoration of habitat in the upper Yuba.

We strongly believe restoring spring run Chinook and steelhead to the upper Yuba River is necessary for their continued existence and fits squarely within your authority and trust obligations.
